RE-CAP OF JANUARY'S MEETING

Dan Peters was presented the coveted Sommelier Cup by outgoing president, Lisa Nordmnan. In the past, the Sommelier Cup was awarded to the winemaker that won the most ribbons for their wines at the MWS Wine Fair. The sommelier cup was donated by Jane Schweitzer to the club after the death of her husband Jim in the mid 1980s. Jim was a charter member of the club. Now that we no longer have Wine Fairs the Sommelier Cup is presented to each incoming president.

Steve Brunkhorst presented the Favorite Red Wine Plaque to Cris Hiner for his delicious late harvest Chambourcin wine. Congratulations Cris!

Dan Peters and Steve Brunkhorst gave a very informative presentation on the Missouri Gold Medal Winners. The wines tasted were Stone Hill's Brut Rose', a fruit forward Seyval from Montelle, a delicious Vidal Blanc and Chardonel from Augusta, an off dry Vignoles from Augusta and a dry Rose' from Noboleis. The coveted Governor's Cup award for the best Chambourcin went to Stone Hill and the CV Riley Award for the best Norton also went to Stone Hill Winery. Those two reds were full bodied with a wonderful aroma and bouquet. We ended the evening with tasting two desert wines, an Ice Wine from Augusta and a Port from Stone Hill. We had seventeen attendees and this meeting was enjoyed by all.

CONGRATULATIONS TO AWARD WINNING GREG STRICKER

Greg continues to bring in the medals for his delicious wines. From the Kentucky State Fair, Greg's 2019 Chambourcin won 1st place and he received a 2nd place for his 2021 Vignoles and 2021 Vignoler.

From the LA Cellarmasters competition Greg was awarded a Gold for his 2020 Chambourcin, 2021 Viognier, 2021 Chardonel, and 2021 Seyval. He received a Silver for his 2019 Chambourcin, 2019 Norton Bin 2, 2020 Corot Noir, 2021 Vignoles and 2021 Traminette

He received a bronze for his 2018 Norton, 2019 Corot Noir and 2020 Black Raspberry.

Greg also entered wines in the Colorado Association for Viniculture & Enology (CAVE). He received a Gold for his 2021 Chardonel and 2021 Traminette. Silver was awarded for his 2021 Seyval and Bronze for his 2019 Norton, 2020 Chambourcin and 2021 Vignols.
